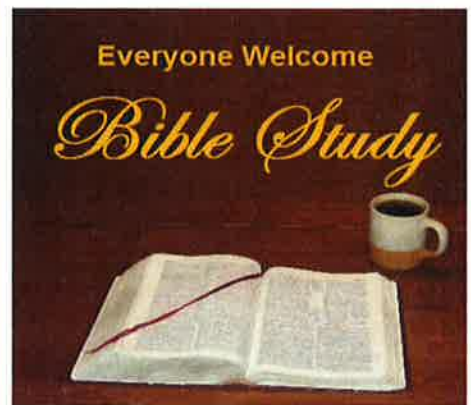

If you are able to help (7th grade through adult) also let me know. As usual, we will meet at church around 8:30 a.m., and hope to finish up by early afternoon. Please bring a rake, gloves and any other tools you have. Water will be provided. Even if you can only help for a couple hours, your help would be greatly appreciated. Thank you for your willingness to serve others. Also, if our Thrivent matching funds come through, we will try to provide a pizza lunch for all workers that day!



As many of you know, the PTL's annual auction will be at a new venue this year - the Tuscan Hall. The PTL Auction committee wanted to provide some background and rationale for why we are changing venues.

Our primary goal is to generate the maximum profit for the school, so that Martin Luther's goal of educating everyone in the Bible can be continued, and result in growth at Beautiful Savior Lutheran School. Over the last seven auctions - through the generous support and participation of church and school families - we have raised over \$82,000 to continue the church's mission to, "Invite people to know Jesus and provide opportunities to grow in His love." Those funds have been used to buy Chromebooks for students, Mimio projectors for the classrooms, the new WiFi system for the school, an outdoor basketball hoop, sports equipment, classroom improvements (furniture, carpets, supplies, etc.), and more.

In our years at Center Court, we had the facility generously donated to us by Harvey Stowe. We then purchased our hot food selections from Center Court, which would range from \$1,000 - \$1,300, and spent another \$300 - \$400 buying cold items (fruit, vegetables, cheese, and crackers). Center Court prepared the hot items, while committee members shopped for, washed, cut, and plated the cold items. It was an annual food cost of \$1,300 - \$1,700, and various committee members spent 10-20 hours on preparation. We would also provide our own bartender and table linens at Center Court on the night of the auction. There would be another 5-10 hours washing and pressing all the table linens by various committee members. On the night of the auction we would have one or two committee members at the food table all night keeping things filled.

Each year we look to improve the auction. Whether the improvement comes in the form of increased income, reduced costs, or more efficient use of committee time - we examine it all. Our food budget and time invested in food preparation has been increasing over the past few years, so that was a focus as we started planning this year's auction. We looked at five venues - including Center Court.

In our search, Tuscan Hall offered the best services for the venue cost. For a fee of \$2,000 they are providing hot and cold food with servers circulating, table linens, and two bartenders. For an incremental cost of \$300, we are saving 15-30 hours of committee time before the auction, and freeing up the food committee to help during the auction in other areas, which should result in a faster and more streamlined checkout.

It was not an easy decision for the committee to make, but when we looked at all of the costs and benefits of our options, and focused on our goal of maximizing profit at the auction - the decision was clear. Just as when we moved the auction from the school gym to Center Court, there will be big changes to the auction this year. We are looking forward to the changes, and hope to see everyone at the auction November 16th, as we continue to grow and develop the event.

 - 3.b.i. Approval of Minutes

3.b.i.1. July 9th, 2018 Board of Director's Meeting: Two amendments were noted, first under #7 "Adjournment" it should read "Pastor Schmidt", not "Pastor Schmidt Wolf". The other amendment was the addition of a note to the end of the minutes that the resolution to rename the Christian Family Life Center the "Boettcher Center" was voted on, and approved at the August 2nd, 2018 "Impromptu Voter's Assembly" after the 6:30 pm service. Al Greeler made a motion to approve the minutes as amended. Tom Daniels seconded. The minutes were approved as amended.

3.b.ii. CHP Administration – Mark Hammel received information from Concordia Plan Services about the selection of next year's health plans. They are asking for a designated administrator to set up an account and manage it. Mark Hammel stated that he will be asking Chris Imler if this would be something she could. He also noted that the personnel committee would need to be convened before August 24th to select a plan.

3.c.iii. Management Report – Financial Review: Tom Daniels reviewed the July 2018 Balance Sheet Prev Year Comparison with the Board. The total income for July 2018 was \$57,743.30 versus \$48,936.61 in July 2017. The total July 2018 expenses were \$52,924.86 resulting in a net ordinary income of \$4,818.44 versus the total July 2017 expenses of \$60,556.47 with a net ordinary loss of \$11,619.86. Also, in July 2018 there were other expenses of \$598.21 resulting in a net income of \$4,220.23 for July 2018 versus a net income of \$6,973.39 in July 2017. The one month total income (July 18) was \$57,743.30 versus the YTD budget amount of \$54,369.91. The total expenses for this period were \$52,924.86 resulting in a net ordinary income of \$4,818.44 versus budget expenses of \$69,625.42 with an YTD budgeted loss of \$15,255.50. The other expenses for this period were -\$598.21 versus the budgeted other expenses of \$190.00. The total net income for the one month period was \$14,220.23 versus the YTD budgeted loss of \$15,065.50.

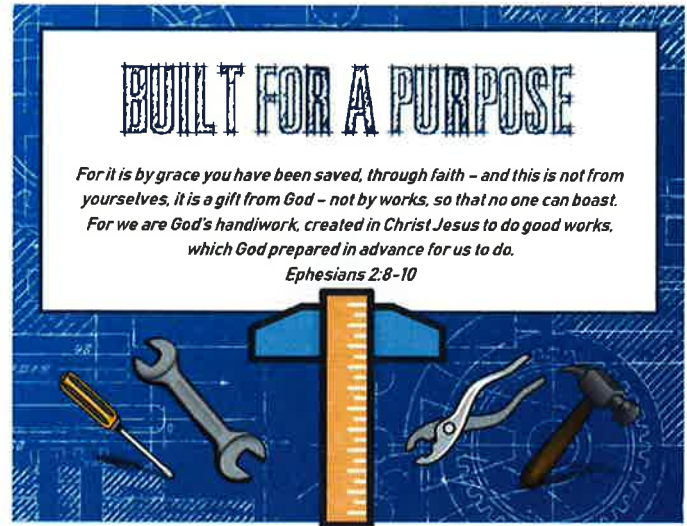


