FROM THE PASTOR

A number of you are part of our Prayer Warriors group and receive periodic emails with various prayer requests, and sometimes updates as to how the Lord is answering the prayers. Many of you also use the yellow communication cards to pass along various prayer requests. Our worship services include times for prayer. Prayer is a part of who we are as God's people at Beautiful Savior. And that's how it should be. Not only does Jesus teach us how to pray, but He also encourages us to ask, seek, and knock. Prayer is a tremendous privilege and gift from God.

So how is your prayer life? As you have heard me say over the years, the basic pattern we see in the Scriptures is: 1) God does something great; 2) Satan tries to mess it up; 3) those who are in Jesus win. Because the evil one does not want us to win, he tries to mess things up, and keep us away from Jesus. One of the ways he does that is to try to get us to abandon prayer or to pray in a way in which we're not putting much thought into what we're saying. We begin to feel that while it might make us feel good, prayer really can't change anything. Or maybe there is the temptation to think that we just don't know how to pray in the right way.

Do you know anyone who always makes you feel comfortable when he or she is around, someone that you can talk with, and share just about anything without fear of rejection or being made fun of? That Person is our God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The evil one would try to change our God's identity into some generic thing that is there, but not in an overly personal way. Our God is much different. The Father in love created and sustains all things, the Son was sent by the Father to become a true human, and die as a substitute for us to cover the guilt of our sin. The Holy Spirit breathes new life in us, connecting us through faith in Jesus to God in a personal relationship as the forgiven, redeemed child of God begun at Baptism. Every time we hear, "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," we are reminded of this good and gracious God who dearly loves us and wants us in this lasting personal relationship with Him, where He would be involved in every area of life.

And so, we are given the gift of prayer – not something by which we try to manipulate God to get our way, but a means of communication through which we give Him thanks and praise, confess our sins, pour out our hearts, and confirm with Him our desire to be with Him, and walk with Him through this life on our way towards heaven.

So, what do we pray about? Everything – even the things that we're ashamed and embarrassed over, for a forgiving God is the only One who can truly do something about it.

The first Christians give us an excellent example to follow: "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." (Acts 2:41) If, per chance, you are feeling that your prayer life is not where you want it to be, start praying about that. The Holy Spirit will have a marvelous way of answering that prayer as He leads you into a deeper relationship with our Lord through His Word, that will give you plenty of things to talk about with our God.

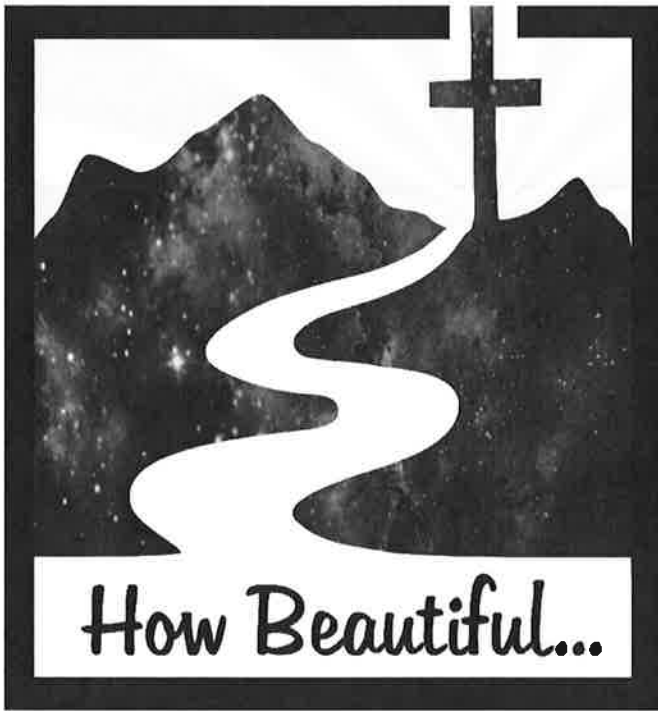
Worship Schedule for the Summer
